FROM STRUGGLE TO HOPE... The Impact OF The Joung Women's Initiative

In 2017, the Women's Fund formally launched a new multi-year initiative to increase the life-long economic security of women and their families by strategically addressing the needs of young women ages 18-29. The initiative includes two programs:

Starting Point 2.0

A two-generation approach to reducing poverty, this program strengthens families through empowerment workshops for young, lowincome mothers and quality early childhood education for their children.

EMPOWHER

Launched in 2018, EmpowHER is geared toward young women ages 18-29 who are not parents, covering many of the same topics as Starting Point 2.0 such as financial literacy, confidence, selfesteem, career planning and conflict management.
